KA5MSV(David) announced that as interim newsletter editor, he welcomes all articles, but published articles must be clearly identified as such in order that proper credit can be given. A motion was made, seconded and unanimously passed that a subscription be paid for the newsletter that the american Radio News Service publishes, since this is an excellent source of information for our own newsletter. Questionaire sheets that club members received should be completed and sent to KA5MSV(David) or WD5CHC(Vern) as soon as possible.

John Campbell (K5ENA), communications officer for the Divil Defense, gave a sobering and thought-provoking program on how we, as citizens of the Tulsa area, could prepare for and cope with a nuclear attack.

The three basic ideas are:

- 1. the crucial importance of advance planning and evacuation
- 2. the defenses of mass, distance and time
- 3. the known effects

The greatest danger of all is a sense of complete hopelessness.

The meeting concluded with a recognition of Old Timer's Night. W5NDE(Art) and W5FU(Bert) related some of their experiences and challenges in the earlier days of amateur radio.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:35.
