# 1 Attendance

#### 2 Introductions

WA5MA introduced the club officers present: First Vice President Jack, W5JHC; Secretary Andrew, W5AWS; Treasurer Jerry, KE5PMK; Repeater Trustee, Gregg, W5GGW; ARES coordinator for Tulsa County, Paul, WB5ANX; and Public Service Liaison, Bart, N5TWB.

#### 3 Presentation

We welcomed guest speaker Mike Grogan, TV Meteorologist for Fox23 and storm chaser who delivered a presentation on the characteristics and effects of severe weather that included its dangers and what one should and should not do. Communications during severe weather is extremely important for delivery of timely warnings to local communities; there is always need for more volunteers to be trained in spotting and delivery of ground-truth reports to the National Weather Service. Properly trained Amateur Radio operators are a valuable resource in any emergency situation. Mike said that he is getting ready to take his Amateur Radio Technician licensing exam so that he can join the Amateur Radio community of operators.

### 4.5 Financials

### 4.6 GC Ham Fest, Bike Events, ARES, Repeater

WA5MA called upon Paul, WB5ANX, for his reports.

WB5ANX said that anyone who has completed their ARES training manuals should contact him for review of their material.

WB5ANX said that he needs volunteers to help staff the club tables at the upcoming Green Country Hamfest as well as be greeters at the front and rear doors. Volunteers who contribute at least two hours of their time will be eligible for the chance to win in a drawing for two gift cards.

WB5ANX said that registration for the upcoming biking events is open on the club website. We need volunteers to be SAG drivers, route sweepers, to help with assembly and disassembly of equipment, and to act as net control operators. Anyone who would like to learn how to become involved should sign-on to ride-along with experienced Safety And Gear (SAG) drivers, helping to communicate with net control.

WB5ANX said that the 145.110 repeater exhibits intermittent crackling that may be due to degraded feed-line or antenna, which will be expensive to replace. The feedline is inherited and old. We are considering less expensive alternatives to the existing system should replacement become necessary.
