2 Introductions

WA5MA introduced the club officers present: First Vice President Jack, W5JHC; Second Vice President Ky, KY5VAR; Secretary Andrew, W5AWS; Treasurer Jerry, KE5PMK; Repeater Trustee, Gregg, W5GGW; ARES coordinator for Tulsa County, Paul, WB5ANX; and Public Service Liaison, Bart, N5TWB.

2.1 Round-robin

WA5MA initiated a round-robin roll-call of those present in the audience.

3 Business

3.1 Green Country Ham Fest

WA5MA asked for a show of hands from those present who attended the Green Country Ham Fest. Nearly everyone present raised their hands. Gregg, W5GGW, said that he thought attendance there was the best since the pandemic. Consensus of the meeting was that the event was a big success.

3.2 Newsletter

WA5MA asked whether any club member present is not receiving the newsletter: Nothing heard.

3.3 Recognition

Club president, Mark Adams, WA5MA, presented a certificate of recognition to Second Vice President Ky, KY5VAR, for his good work for the club.

3.4 Minutes

WA5MA asked if anyone is not receiving the newsletter: nothing heard.

WA5MA asked whether there are questions or comments about the minutes of the last meeting as published in the newsletter: nothing heard.

WA5MA asked for a motion to approve the minutes as written. Daryl, N5NYT, moved to approve the minutes as written.

WA5MA asked for a second. Ky, KY5VAR, seconded the motion. Motion approved by acclamation.

3.5 Financials

WA5MA asked whether there were any questions or comments about the January and February financial reports.

Treasurer Jerry, KE5PMK, said the ham-fest raffle produced a total income of \$961, Total cost of the club presence was \$639. We received \$1,340 in membership dues, which brings the year-to-date receipts to \$2,720. KE5PMK said that balance of the club sinking fund now stands at \$5,300.

WA5MA asked for a motion to approve the financial reports; Daryl, N5NYT, so moved; Logan, KJ5EDE, seconded. Motion approved by acclamation.

3.6 ARES, Repeater, Bikes

WA5MA called upon Paul, WB5ANX, for his reports.

3.6.1 ARES

WB5ANX said that he received three completed ARES training manuals, which he will review, and urged anyone else interested in participating to visit the club web-

3.6.2 Repeaters

WB5ANX said that all the repeaters are working. However, the Internet back-haul of the Keetonville repeater is inoperative, causing problems for wide-area DMR connectivity. Bob, W5RAB, provided a Starlink Mini node to get things going again temporarily. The team is working on a permanent local Internet access.

3.6.3 Bikes

WB5ANX said that registration for the upcoming biking events is open on the club website. We need volunteers to be SAG drivers, route sweepers, to help with assembly and disassembly of equipment, and to act as net control operators. Anyone who would like to learn how to become involved should sign-on to ridealong with experienced Safety And Gear (SAG) drivers, helping to communicate with net control.

WB5ANX said that the volunteers for the Tour de Tulsa bicycle event are enough to provide coverage, but he could use a few more helpers. 3.7 Approvals to support Upcoming Events

WA5MA asked for a motion to approve club support of the Ride to Remember and Tulsa Tough bicycle events. Jack, W5JHC, so moved; Ky, KY5VAR seconded; motion approved by general acclamation.

3.7.1 Liability

From the floor, someone asked whether we are covered by liability insurance. Treasurer Jerry, KE5PMK, said that the club has \$1M liability insurance. Paul, WB5ANX, said that organizers of each event carry liability insurance too.

3.8 OK POTA

WA5MA said that Tony, KA5TRO, isn't here to discuss the Oklahoma Parks On The Air (POTA) event scheduled for the weekend of April 19 & 20 when the OK POTA Association will endeavor to activate as many of the state parks as possible.

3.9 Skywarn Net Changes

WA5MA said that changes to the Skywarn Net will be announced on-air during the next scheduled event.

3.10 TARC Net Logging

WA5MA asked David, K5TZS, to rise and talk about logging of our Tuesday evening nets on the Superlink system.

K5TZS said that N5LOL and W5AWS who usually log the net, except when Dirk W4IPD does on the third Tuesday of each month, have discussed changing from Netlogger to HAM.LIVE.

K5TZS illustrated his exposition with a few PowerPoint slides showing side-by-side comparison of the two systems.

K5TZS said that we have been doing dual logging since the beginning of March and now recommend that we abandon Netlogger in favor of HAM.LIVE.

Netlogger requires installation on your computer whereas HAM.LIVE is accessible from any device that supports a web-browser.

K5TZS said that HAM.LIVE automatically logs users as soon as they connect. Also, users can signal they have traffic by raising a hand icon.

Most importantly, K5TZS said that HAM.LIVE chat is instantaneous unlike Netlogger that exhibits unacceptable latency.

Further, K5TZS said that HAM.LIVE is much easier for new users to learn unlike Netlogger that proved difficult.

K5TZS said that HAM.LIVE emails nicely formatted reports at closure of the net. It can also email registered users a message that a net is about to start,

WA5MA asked for the opinion of W5AWS.

W5AWS moved that we adopt HAM.LIVE to replace Netlogger for the Tuesday night TARC Net; Jack, W5JHC, seconded; motion approved by acclamation.

K5TZS yielded the floor to WA5MA.

3.11 Field Day

WA5MA invited Jack, W5JHC to rise and talk about Field Day.

W5JHC delivered a slide presentation showing the status of Field Day planning for 2025. Venue will be at Haikey Creek Park Tri-Plex on the weekend of 28 & 29 June, 2025.

Food is a notable question this year since last year only a few of the persons who said they would come came to eat the food, which resulted in wasted food and money. This year we need to cut the cost by doing something different, a difference that is yet to be determined.
